February 20 City Council Meeting

At their regularly scheduled meeting of February 20, the City Council:

- Adopted two resolutions allowing the City to submit competitive and non-competitive grant applications to the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle)
- Authorized the City Manager to execute Program Supplement Agreements for CalTrans grants
- Approved the first reading of Ordinance No. 002-2024 regarding signs and murals
- Approved the Final Entitlement Report prepared for a 62.5-acre City-owned property
- Approved the placement of two City-owned anchors to the Veterans' Homes and American Legion Post #178 on Saint Francis Way with a condition that they can be moved at a later date
- Approved a budget allocation for the Municipal Services Review and Sphere of Influence Update
- Awarded an Economic Development fund grant up to \$10,000 to Pizza Factory

The City Council also received the following:

- A presentation regarding the Draft Economic Development Strategic Plan. Staff will provide updates based on feedback received for Council consideration of approval at its March 5th City Council meeting.
- An informational presentation regarding parking meters and enforcement

CalRecycle Corrective Action Plan and Senate Bill 1383 (Organics Recycling) Implementation

We anticipate City Council's consideration of an amendment to the MDRR franchise agreement on March 5, regarding SB 1383 implementation. A letter was sent to CalRecycle requesting a short extension to allow for approval and implementation of SB 1383 requirements.

Storm-Related Activities

Public Works staff has worked overtime during the storms to ensure drains remained clear and pumps functioned. They patrolled the city and ensured localized flooding was handled right away and kept the city safe.

Cannabis Conditional Use Permits (CUP)

Cannabis CUP authorization letters and applications were sent out for seven (7) businesses. They are all in compliance. When their applications are received, they will receive an administrative renewal of their CUP for two years.
